The Mixed Choir of Agria is accompanied by Zéfis Katsarou - piano while Lefteris Makropoulos and Maro Stamopoulou join as a soloists. The chorus of Southern Pelion accompanies an orchestral ensemble consisting of: Panos Galanopoulos - piano, Freedom Fragoudaki - flute, Nikos Papathanassiou - guitar and Achilleas Tolidis - crossbass.

The Agria Mixed Choir was founded in 1995 and consists of amateur choirs from Agria and Volos, who are joined by their love for music and choral singing. It completes this year nineteen years of creative and upward learning, in which they have participated in many festivals in Greece and abroad (Romania, Slovakia, Cyprus, Thiva, Drama, Karpenissi, Litochoro, Thessaloniki, Perama, Sperchiada, Elassona, Trikala, Gythio, Sparta, Tripoli, etc.).



The Choir of Agria is a point of reference for the cultural life of the region and organizes every year the Choirs of Agria, with the participation of choirs from Greece and abroad.

The artistic direction and teaching has been for 17 years the well-known conductor, Vlassis Mastrogiannis, who for many years has developed a significant activity as a music teacher and choir director of our region.





Horthodia (as it the choral ensemble was named after its first appearance in Horto in the summer of 2012) consists of residents of the area of Southern Pelion. It is an amateur choir, an alliance of nationalities, people with an appetite and a love for singing, sharing the joy of music and artistic creation.

With the encouragement and support of the Angelini-Hatzinikos Foundation, embraced by the active Developmental Association of Horto, the enthusiastic participation of the Friends of the Kalderimi and the guidance of the musician and pianist Nikos Adraskelas, Hortodia already counts many dynamic appearances in it's portfolio of performances.
